Having spent many years in the screenprinting industry, I had come to accept the combination of textile spray adhesive and t-shirt lint as a necessary evil. Floors, presses, computers, tabletops, boxes - nothing immune from the relentless buildup of spray adhesive overspray.

From time to time I would visit a friend's shop across town, and was always surprised by (and envious of) just how clean the production area was. I mean CLEAN, always, and he was running a manual *and* an 8 color automatic in there!

When I asked him how he managed to keep such a clean shop, he showed me a device he was developing which keeps the vast majority of the spray adhesive on the pallets, not in the air. Anyone who has ever pointed a can of textile spray adhesive at a pallet knows where most of the spray always ends up - which is everywhere but on the pallet.

Shortly afterward, he showed up at my place with one of these devices under his arm, for me to test and evaluate. I have a small operation, but we do a fair amount of textile printing, especially contract printing, and here's the deal: The ONLY time that this thing comes OFF OF my press is when we just can't lose a print head, which is rare. Since that day it has been so much easier to keep my shop area clean that now even my customers are noticing the difference.
